pack a picnic

Who doesn't love a picnic? With Loring Park and the Sculpture Garden just a short walk away, June is the perfect time to get out and enjoy the neighborhood. Don't forget our own rooftop decks for an impromptu picnic.

Nothing can spoil a picnic like unpacking your basket and realizing you forgot an essential—not so much. Use this checklist to make sure you've got it all.

Food and Beverages

Casual foods, preferably sandwiches or other things you can eat without utensils.

Avoid foods with mayonnaise. Pack everything in lightweight, resealable containers.

Ice pack or bags of ice. Keep everything cold with refreezable ice packs, or fill a couple of resealable bags with ice cubes: They'll chill food as it's transported. Add ice cubes to drinks during the picnic.

Drinks + Condiments + Salt and pepper

Tableware

Cups and plates. Whether you choose eco-friendly paper, plastic, or bamboo, lightweight, stackable dishes make packing easy.

Napkins. If you prefer not to use cloth, look for ones made of recycled paper or other materials.

Serving utensils + Small cutting board + Corkscrew or bottle opener

Cleanup

Trash bags. Don't leave a mess behind. Dispose of everything you bring to the picnic site.

Moist towelettes + Paper towels

Miscellaneous

Blanket. It should be large enough to comfortably hold all your picnic-goers and food.

Tote, backpack, or picnic basket. Stow everything in a lightweight, roomy carrier.

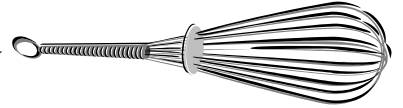
